

For GPS to be effective, the ELT should be located near a window but the internal back-up antenna is the most important factor. This development supersedes our own SASD (Secondary Antenna Switching Device) which we patented in 2006. 

ELT Issues Programming Dongles

Some aircraft are arriving into NZ with programming dongles already in the wiring harness. If these are programmed for "test" or still in the original country code where the aircraft was imported from, it is important that the dongle is re-programmed not the ELT. If the ELT is programmed and then inserted back into the wiring then the dongle will override the ELT programming. A recent accident highlighted this as the 406MHz signal was not seen by RCC. The dongle was programmed for test as it often is when it is a new ELT

installation. The dongles are very hard to tell apart but when they are used, **the ELT should be always labelled accordingly.**
